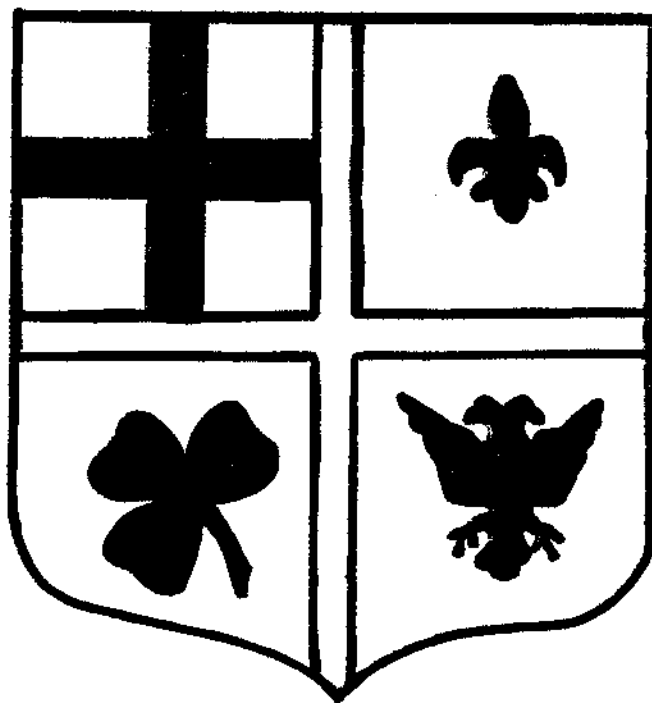

MORE NEWS FROM KANKAKEE GAZETTE - 1854

Oct. 14, 1854 - Dateline Baltimore Oct. 6, 1854. At Charleston the run of deaths last week listed 108, including 72 from Yellow Fever. On Monday last there were only 2 deaths from the fever in that city. Augusta, on Saturday last, there were 6 deaths from the fever. The alarm had somewhat subsided, although the doses so showed no abatement. At Montgomery, the fever has ceased its ravages. On Tuesday there were only 2 deaths at Savannah, 12 at Charleston, while at Augusta there were none.

October 21 - The Honorable Hugh Henderson, Judge, will preside the second Monday in November, the 13th for "special term of the Circuit Court".

October 21 - WANTED A good faithful boy, from 10 to 14 years of age, to reside with me until he is 21 years of age. I will give him a common school education. (signed) J. E. Chipman

October 21 - To whom it may concern: Notice is hereby given that I shall appear to the Circuit Court at the November term thereof, 1854, Kankakee County, State of Illinois, to sell by order of said Court, all the real estate of Francois Alexander, situated and being in the said County of Kankakee, for the purpose of raising means to support and educate his infant heirs Sardlae Alexander, Emily Alexander and Esther Alexander, when and where all persons interested can appear and make objections, if any they have. (signed) F. N. Martin, Guardian of the property of said heirs. October 24, 1852, Paddock & Ward, Solicitors.

Also, notice of an Administrator's sale by Simon B. Hatch and E. R. Hatch of Limestone dated August 12, 1854, the administrators for John M. Ashley, deceased. Sale to be held November 11, 1854.

A line of stages will be run between Urbana and Danville; also, from Urbana to Peoria, via Monticello, LeRoy and Kappa, and from Urbana to Springfield via Bloomington. E. B. Mason, General Superintendent and Engineer, J. B. Wyman, Assistant Agent.

One little "filler" found simply states "Kankakee City, of all the places out west, stands merely at the head."

There was a small article stating that "the railroad under contract with Messrs. R. J. Welker and Co. for 60 miles of railroad to be completed in 18 months and 100 miles to be built every year thereafter until the road is finished across the state."

In a column titled "On Books" Ford's History of Illinois. A History of Illinois from its commencement as a State - 1518 to 1847 by the first governor Thomas Ford. 1 Vol - 12 mo of 450 pages. (Does any reader have any information on this particular book?)

On October 30, 1854, the paper gave reviews of papers and magazines from "Maine to Kansas" and states they all gave highest praises and the "Illinois Gazette" stated (the above book) is the very best History of Illinois that was ever published--not an ordinary history--but such a history of "man and times" as can be obtained from no other source.

October 7 - Notice given of a real estate sale of farm lands of Silas Clark of Momence, Kankakee County, deceased and mentioned as heirs were: Albert H., Jno. F., Lewis P., Frederick O., Caroline T. Johnson, Julia Ann, Mary E., and Amelia A. Nathan W. Stetson and Julia Ann Stetson (nee Clark) are the guardians of Lewis B., Frederick O., and Amelia A. (the minor heirs.) Dated October 5, 1854 by N. Briant, Attorney.

November 11, 1854 - Indian Massacres in Oregon. The article lists the following persons of a party attacked on the 20th October. Alexander Ward, wife and 7 children from Lexington, Missouri; Samuel Mellagon, Missouri; Mr. Babcock, lawyer from Vermont and most recently from Missouri; Dr. Adams and brother Charles, both from Michigan; Mrs. White and child from Michigan (her husband lives in the Umpqua Valley); 2 Germans and 1 Frenchman, names not known.

Nov. 11, 1854 - "A small daily, called the Chicago Herald, has just started in Chicago. Daniel O'Hara, Editor. It is anti-know-nothing."

Also, "A colony of Germans from Cincinnati are preparing to emigrate to Kansas. They propose to found a city."

And, dateline "Decatur Gazette" "A party of 30 Kentuckians, and their slaves, passed through Missouri last week on their way to Kansas. Hundreds of wagons are passing through our city weekly, laden with men, women, children and their furniture, bound for the "Little Giant's" territories. While we are penning this item, 17 wagons are passing through."

This little filler from 1854 provides some "food for thought". "In Virginia there are 80,000 whites who can neither read or write. There are hundreds of thousands of mulatto ruins without position of manhood or womanhood, liable to be sold by their white parents or brothers and sisters at any moment to make up for real estate loss."

How about this one? Think our nations drug problems are recent? Nov. 18, 1854 - Narcotics and Poison We Use - The Chemistry of Common Life which is now going through the place, states that tobacco is

produced to the extent of 4,480,000,000 pounds annually, and is used by 800,000 men; opium among 400,000 of men; Indian hemp, among 250,000 of men; Betel nut (or Pinang) among 100,000,000 men; cacao, among 10,000 of men. Little is known in Europe of the-use of hemp as a narcotic,. yet in the East it is as familiar to the voluptuary as the opium or tobacco of other nations. The value of these articles is fixed at \$60,500,000 annually.

Nov. 18 - Died at Limestone on the 13th inst., a child of Mr. ROUNSVILLE. Also, at the same place on the 15th inst, Mr. HUNGERFORD, recently from Livingston County, New York. In this place, on the 16th ult., Charles, an interesting little boy of Mr. HAYES. Also an infant son of Mr. STREETER.

Also on Nov. 18, A. L. SMALL ran an ad stating the Kankakee Nursery now had one million Osage Orange plants at their nursery in Rockville, Illinois.

And, the editor inserted this little article.- "We notice in one of the Dubuque papers a statement that 65,000 acres of land were sold in the Land Office in that place in two days."

Nov. 2 - Died in this city, on the 25th inst. Mr. C. C. RIPLEY, age 2 years and 3 months.

Died in this city on the 11th inst., Mrs. Betsey INGRAM, aged 60 years and 6 months.

Died at her residence near this place, Mrs. Almira G. TRUE, wife of Mr. Abram TRUE, aged 55 years. The death of Mrs. True has made a sad breach upon a large and interesting family.

Died in Limestone on the 13th inst. after a long and severe illness, Mrs. Sally HATCH, wife of Earlman R. HATCH, aged 29 years. She leaves a large circle of friends, a husband and two small children.

Died in Brooklyn, Ohio, on the 25th of November, Mrs. Mathilda CHESTER in the 97th year of her age. She was one of the last remnants of a large family of 15 children upon which the first sad inroads were made by the massacre at Fort Griswald, Conn. Sept. 6th, 1781. At the close of that sad and eventful day, she with others of the family went in search for three brothers who had just reached the maturity of manhood, and who had that morning, left the parental roof to defend the place against the English forces, led by the infamous ARNOLD. One of these brothers was claimed a prisoner on board the notorious Prison Ship, et New York, and the two others had fallen at the head of those butchers, and lay covered with their blood. She has left numerous offspring, who add in no small measure to the character both social and religious, and left its flavorful impress upon others.

Dec. 16 - Died at Limestone on the 6th inst., Mrs. Abiah VAUGHN, in her 93rd year of her age. Her greatest attachment to earth seemed to be that she might associate with her young son, who had been absent for many years, and a short time previous to her death, she was grateful in that desire,
