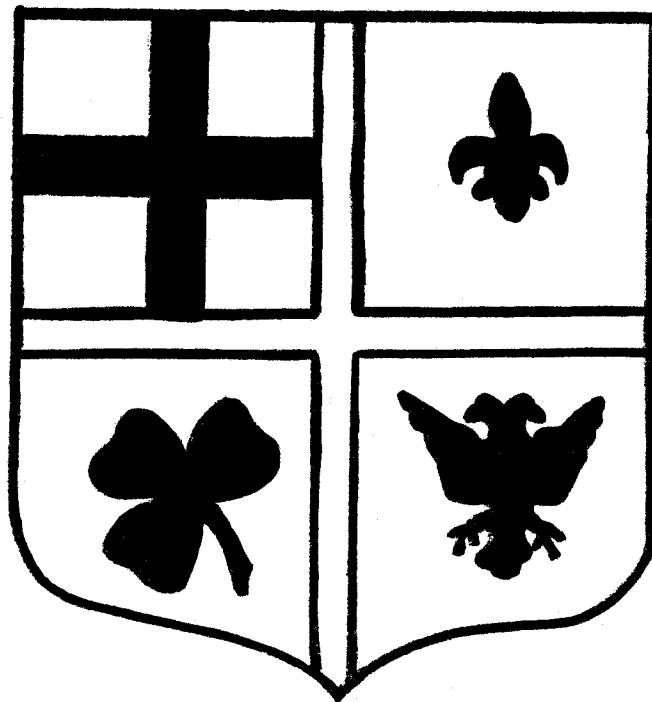
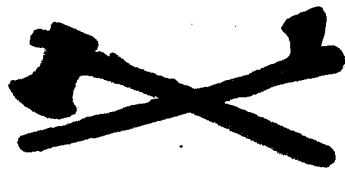

The following two pages were sent in January, 1982, to our Mr. Regnier by Mr. John Daly, Director, Illinois State Archives for Jim Edgar, Secretary of State and State Archivist.

Mr. Daly also wrote, "Requests should be brief and limited to two specific individuals. Also, please request a search of only one census year or record source at a time. It is not necessary to enclose a stamped return envelope with your letters. Do not send cash or checks with your request. If there is a charge, you will be billed."

## GENEALOGICAL RECORDS AND MAIL RESEARCH POLICY OF THE ILLINOIS STATE ARCHIVES

The Illinois State Archives, Springfield, Illinois 62756, is open Monday through Friday from 8:00 A.M. until 4:30 P.M. It is also open on Saturday from 8:00 A.M. until 3:30 P.M., except on holiday weekends. The Archives staff will do a limited amount of research in reply to mail requests. The services of the Archives are provided at no charge through the courtesy of the Secretary of State. Please follow these guidelines when requesting information by mail:

1. Ask only for one or two specific items at a time;
2. Designate the specific record to be searched (the year for a census record, the war for a service record);
3. Provide the complete name(s) of the person(s) to be searched (no more than two at a time);
4. Please do not submit a second request until you have received an answer to your first request.

### CENSUS RECORDS

1810-1855. The Archives has an index covering state and federal census records for this time span. We will search this index for two specifically named individuals, first as well as surnames, for one census year in a designated county location.

1860-1870. Indexes are presently being made for the 1860 census. Only Fayette, Franklin, and Union Counties are indexed for 1870. We will search these indexes for two individually named people in a designated county. We will also search the un-indexed 1860 and 1870 schedules for two complete names in a township location. We do not search the un-indexed schedules of Illinois cities.

1880. There is an index to the 1880 census called Soundex. It lists only those households having children ten years old or younger at the time of the 1880 enumeration. We can search the Soundex when the name of the head of the household is provided. (To determine the correct family it may also be necessary to provide county location and names of wife and children). We will also search the 1880 schedules for two persons if a definite township location is provided. We do not search the 1880 schedules of the Illinois cities.

1890. The 1890 Federal census records were destroyed by fire in 1921 in Washington, D. C.

1900. There is a complete Soundex to this census. We will check that index if the name of the head of the family is provided. We do not make a further search in the actual schedules if the name is not found on the Soundex.

State Censuses. Although there were state censuses taken before 1855, schedules for very few counties survived. To search the un-indexed 1865 census we must have a township location. Again, we do not search the schedules for the cities. The 1865 census was the last state census taken. State census schedules listed only the head of family by name. Other family members are shown by-numerical totals in age categories.

### VITAL RECORDS

The only death records at the Illinois State Archives are the Federal Mortality Schedules, for the years 1850, 1860, 1870, and 1880. These records show only those deaths that occurred in the one year prior to the beginning of the enumeration. As an example, the 1850 Mortality Schedule would show deaths that occurred between June 1, 1849, and May 31, 1850. All 1870 Mortality Schedules for Illinois counties beginning with letters "A" through "K" are missing. We will search 1850 and 1860 Mortality Schedule indexes for one or two names with a county location. To search the un-indexed 1870 and 1880 schedules, please provide a township location.

Most Illinois counties did not keep birth and death records until 1877. Between 1877 and 1916 if the event was recorded it would be found in the county clerks' office of the county in which it occurred. After 1916, the event is recorded not only in the county clerks' offices but also with the Department of Public Health, Office of Vital Records, 535 West Jefferson Street, Springfield, Illinois 62761. The personnel of that division will search their records for a birth or death certificate if provided with an approximate date and location. The fee is three dollars. Early marriage records are found in the various county clerk's offices.

#### WAR RECORDS

The Archives has indexes to men serving in Illinois units during the Indian Wars, Black Hawk War, the Mexican War, the Civil War, and the Spanish-American War. We will search a specified index and send reports on two soldiers. We will also search the Honor Roll of Veterans Buried in Illinois for two names with a county location.

#### LAND RECORDS

The Archives has records from the ten federal land district offices in Illinois. These include only the first purchase of the land from the government, information contained in these records includes the name of the purchasers; the dates of purchase, exact legal descriptions of the land, and residences at the time of purchase. The former place of residence is not shown. We will search a computer-generated index to these records for one or two names (first as well as last). Later land transactions between individuals were recorded in the county courthouses.

#### COUNTY HISTORIES

The Archives holds many published Illinois county histories. We will check the indexes of specified counties for one or two names and send copies of biographical sketches if they are found.

#### COUNTY RECORDS

The State Archives has microfilm copies of records found in some Illinois county courthouses (mostly southern Illinois counties). You are welcome to use these films at the Archives but our staff does not search them in answer to mail requests....The Illinois Regional Archives Depository system (IRAD) contains additional county records. IRAD staff will perform a limited amount of research by mail. For further information, write to Information Services/IRAD, Archives Building, Springfield, Illinois 62756.

#### INTER-LIBRARY LOAN

Films of the state census schedules for 1855 and 1865, the federal population schedules for 1850, 1860, 1870, and 1900 as well as the 1900 Soundex are available through the inter-library loan system. The "Name Index to Early Illinois Records" (census records index 1810-1850) and the war indexes are also available on loan from the State Library. These should be requested by the surname for which you are searching. Your local librarian must make the request from the Illinois State Library, Centennial Building, Springfield, Illinois 62756.

#### DESCRIPTIVE INVENTORY

For a complete description of all of the record groups in the Archives, consult The Descriptive Inventory of the Archives of the State of Illinois (Springfield, 1978). A copy may be in a local library. It may be purchased for \$20.00 from the Illinois State Archives. If you order a copy make your check payable to Secretary of State,...The Guide to Record Holdings Illinois State Archives is permanently out of print.

As of December 10, 1981, the National Archives has discontinued loaning census microfilm. To help fill that need, you may RENT your census and soundex microfilm.

Send \$15.00 (\$5.00 plus \$10.00) in check or money order for each reel of microfilm you wish to rent. Enclose a self-addressed stamped cont'd

envelope for your refund. Allow six to eight weeks for delivery. No microfilm will be sent without advance payment.

When ordering the census, please indicate the year, state, and county of the microfilm you wish to search.

When ordering the soundex, please indicate the year, state, and surname which you wish to search.

Return the microfilm, insured, within the month rental period and the \$10.00 deposit will be refunded.

#### CALENDAR DATINGS

This Editor just became aware of the fact that it wasn't until 1752 when the American Colonies began using the Gregorian calendar system which is our present style of calendar. I had always thought that the calendar system had been changed so long ago that it didn't matter. How wrong assumptions can be.

In 1582 Europe corrected the old Julian calendar to make up for errors in "solar" time by adding {advancing} eleven days. At this time they also changed the beginning of the new year to January 1st instead of March 25th. All countries accepted this method of dating except for Great Briton and all of their colonies which kept using the old Julian system with its March 25th new year.

In 1752 the British Parliament finally adapted our present Gregorian calendar. Therefore you can see why there was confusion over dates in our young country due to the different nationalities which settled here. For examples George Washington was born on February 11, 1731 according to England, but to the rest of the world his birthday was February 22, 1732. In his family bible, George Washington's birth date was "double-dated" as 1731/32.

So, if in your research prior to 1752, dates on different records don't seem to quite mesh, remember that March 25th used to be the beginning of a year for the English and that they were eleven days behind in dates. After 1752, in correcting these dates, everything from January 1st to March 25th then became the next year.

Hope I haven't confused you too much since I'm still trying to get it straight in my mind.

#### PRESERVING OLD NEWSPAPERS

While reading over some older issues of the Iroquois Stalker, I ran across the following which might be of interest to some of you.

Iroquois found it in the Decatur Gen. Newsletter and I quote,

"DO YOU KNOW HOW TO PRESERVE OLD NEWSPAPER CLIPPINGS? - This information comes via the Houston Post (copied from "The Living Terie News").

1. Dissolve a Milk of Magnesia tablet in 1 qt. of club soda overnight.
2. Pour into a large tray or pan and soak the clippings for an hour.
3. Remove from tray and pat dry.

This process will stretch the life expectancy of the newspaper up to 200 years. Cannot be done to handwritten articles--only printed matter or papers written in permanent ink. Might test a corner of the paper first."

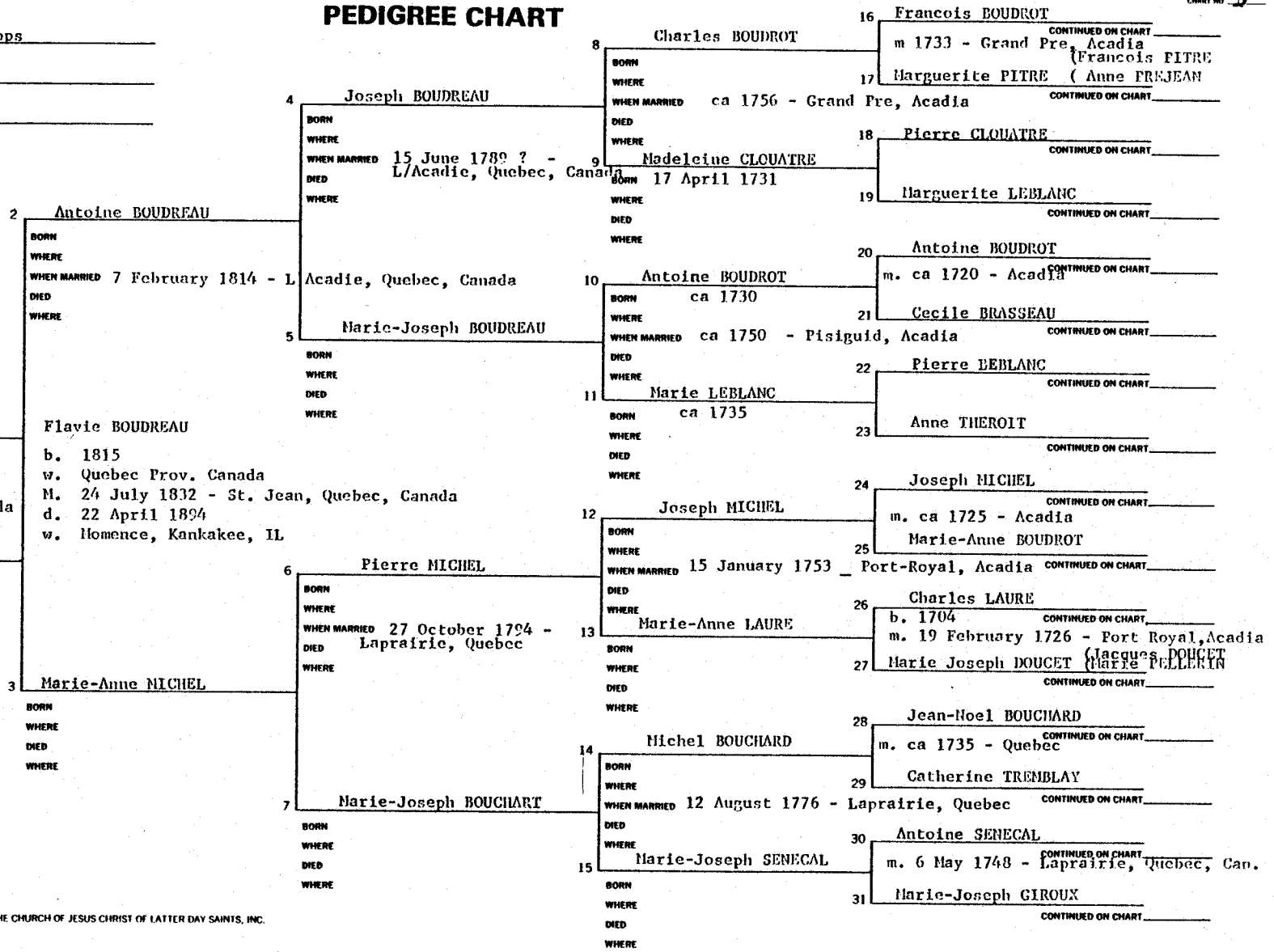
