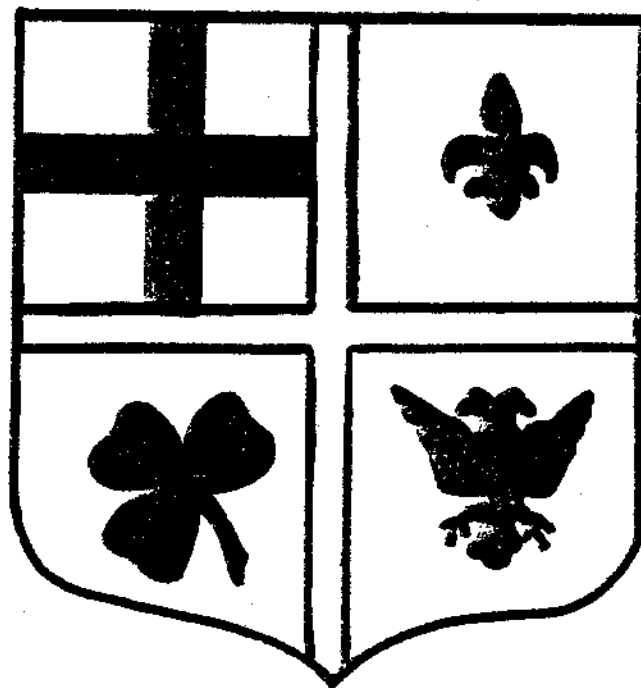

ANNOUNCEMENT

CHANGES IN PROCESSING REQUESTS FOR COPIES OF
VETERANS' RECORDS AND PASSENGER ARRIVAL RECORDS

Effective May 1, 1984, all requests for copies of military service records or passenger arrival records must be submitted on NATF Forms 80 and 81, respectively. After May 1 prior versions of these forms (NATF Form 26 and NATF Form 40) will not be accepted for processing. All forms other than the NATF Form 80 or NATF Form 81 that are received after May 1 will be returned.

A change in payment policies will also take effect May 1, 1984. NABS has in the past required that payment accompany requests for copies of veterans records and passenger arrival records. After May 1, 1984 payment should not be sent with the NATF forms 80 and 81. NABS will research the request, prepare copies of any records located, and HOLD THE COPIES FOR 30 days or until payment is received, whichever is sooner. As soon as records are located and copied, researchers will receive a bill and instructions on returning their remittances.

Researchers should also submit a separate NATF-Form 80 for each file (pension or bounty-land or compiled military service) desired. Previously researchers could ask for multiple files on one form. This change is designed to facilitate processing by the National Archives. PUBLICATIONS

....Taken from The Salina Journal-Wednesday, Sept. 16, 1981; (Salina, Kansas 67401) "Smoky Valley Roots" by Judy Lilly, Genealogy Writer.

"An extremely useful book in determining the evidence of many small towns or post offices which operated for a time and then closed or experienced a name change is one by Robert W. Baughman called KANSAS POST OFFICES. It is the result of a project sponsored by the Kansas State Historical Society. The book includes names of post offices in Kansas and the first appointees between May 29, 1828 and August 3, 1961.

"At least three other sources are available which gives names of clusters of settlements that may have been familiar to an ancestor but which are now unheard of. A. T. Andreas' HISTORY OF KANSAS lists post offices discontinued, established or had names changed from December 1, 1881 to November 24, 1882. Volume seven of the KANSAS COLLECTIONS contains an article listing extinct geographical locations, 19 pages of "lost" towns, post offices, overland stations, missions, settlements and trading posts from 1852 to 19720 For anyone interested in Saline County, The Kansas Room at the Salina Public Library has a map, nicely done a few summers ago by Steve Reed, which names and locates all towns and post offices that ever existed in this county."

(In answer to an inquiry of this editor for a place called Pine Village or Pine Valley that my great-grandparents visited in the early 1900's, the above was submitted by Sylvia Thiel (#198). I felt the information might be of interest to many of you.)

Mrs. Thiel further relates that "in Andrea's HISTORY OF KANSAS, published in 1883, that in 1882 Kansas ranked 10th in the nation as far as existing post offices were concerned with 1,563. The history of Kansas post offices precedes even the history of the state, for the first one was established on May 29, 1828 and was called Cantonment Leavenworth. The first post office was attached administratively to Clay County, Missouri and was sometimes called LaPlatte.
