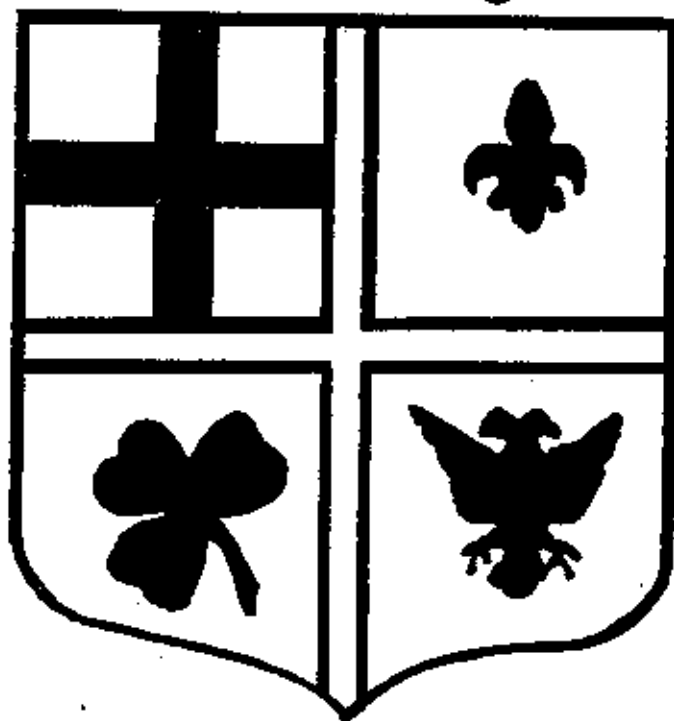

ST. ANNE SWEEPSTAKES

Taken from The Kankakee Gazette, February 4, 1875.

Mr. John Herron is putting up a residence In old town. Quite a number of additions, sheds, wood or coal houses, and stables have been erected in the village during the last few weeks.

Mr. Marehall has suspended work on his house on account of the cold weather.

There have been several law suits before our justices the past week.

There were three spelling schools in this vicinity last week. We attendec but one, but we came within one of spelling down the crown; that one waE another teacher. Our school will try it this week.

We attended a debate, in Papineau last Friday evening, where It was decide("that Lincoln was (not) a greater man than Washington".

Mrs. Clark has been seriously ill, but we are pleased to learn that she is better again.

We are to have a new lumber yard on the C L & C side track, under the proprietorship of a Chicago firm. The first car load of lumber arrived last Saturday.

The C L & C RR is shipping some grain both ways. Four car loads of stock have been shipped over the same road to Chicago since our last writing. Last week thirteen cars of hay were forwarded from this station by the same route.

The Blakesly hay press, at Collins, has fallen out with the D C & V RR or account of the company failing to build a side-track up to the hay barn. The pressed hay is hauled to St. Anne on wagons and sent to Cincinnati. The press broke on Monday last and has been standing idle ever since on account of an order to Chicago for repairs not being promptly filed.

B. R. Nordyke has transformed his office, at the Union depot, into a kind of "art gallery". His pictures number about one hundred and are as various as numerous.

Since Mr. Blain moved from the Chiniquy building the store room has beer undergoing a course of cleaning and white washing, preparatory to receiving A. Chiniquy's stock of new goods.

Mr. Ashline, the tax collector, says he was kept busy making out receipt: all day Saturday last. He seemed to think it all very fine, but then, he didn't hear the words of the farmers after they were out of his office.

School District No. 6, in this town, went In debt \$3.50 for furniture last week - after signing the order the directors all left home for fear of the people.

One of our School ma'ams says she has visitors in school almost daily. Wish we were good-looking, too.

Another teacher recently went with his scholars and spent half a day with another school.

We saw two men almost helplessly intoxicated in the village on Saturday evening. One was at the Union depot when the evening passenger arrived. He climbed upon the platform of the carriage, and then asked us if "this trair was going to St. Anne". We told him yes, but advised him not to go away -to stay where he was for fear of the train running off the track; he

wandered into the depot again and wilted down on a seat, and we left him alone in his glory".

A new carpenter shop has just been opened on Station street.

Mr. Edward Dillbac has recently moved into the neighborhood from near Milford. He was formerly a resident here and will be welcomed back by his friends.

An occasional dance takes place in the country.

Chiniquy's school talks of a concert, but we believe the time is not yet fixed.

Some of our citizens will attend the concert in Kankakee, Tuesday evening.

The mud in the village well has been stirred up again and the pump now brings up a substance of such a consistency as to need a plank walk over it.

We saw a Kankakee Clerk down here the other day - collecting, he said. Wonder what he was collecting.

Papineau is to have a public hall. We understand that the Blain Bros. contemplate building a 40 x 60 feet store room with hall overhead, in this town, next spring.

If the surface of this town had been sand-papered it would have made a first-rate skating rink after the little rain last week.

Religious service at Switzer church next Sabbath.

An 80 acre farm in Papineau was recently sold for \$2,500 and three days after was re-sold for \$2,800.

There was a wedding in the village last Sunday. Miss Columbe and Mr. Arseneau - don't know first names - were the happy couple.

When we wrote the challenge on which we are now working we expected at least half a dozen railway collisions, a few conflagrations, and a score of run-aways, but having been badly disappointed, we think we will have the public sympathy if we are beaten.
