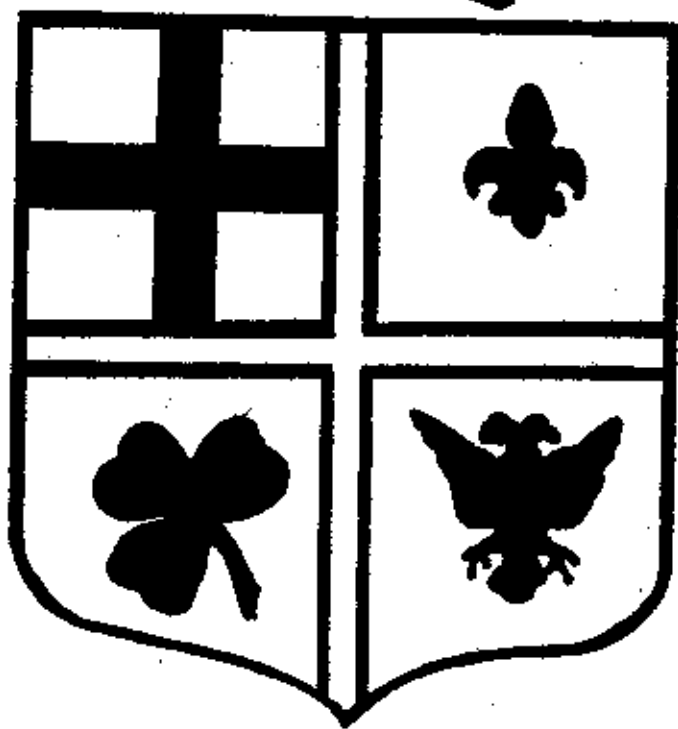

HIGH TONED KANKAKEE

Taken from The Kankakee Gazette September 30, 1875.

Kankakee has experienced something decidedly new in her history, viz; an illumination by gas. This is something which has never before happened, it is unnecessary to remark. But unlike marked innovations generally, it is received with universal favor and satisfaction.

The gas was turned on last Tuesday evening, and in such stores, offices and dwellings as had been fitted with fixtures a brilliant flood of light celebrated the event.

The Gazette tested the efficiency of the new illuminator and the result was entirely satisfactory. It is unnecessary to say that "the boys" were highly delighted with the soft, bright light which enabled them to see every letter in both case and manuscript with the utmost readiness.

At Ald. Funk's the young folks at our German population assembled in honor of the event, and danced the happy hours away. Funk's hall was supplied with a large number of burners, and the illumination was a complete success.

Only two street lamps were in readiness for lighting, one on the alley at the Commercial bank, and the other on alderman Cruise's corner, next door to the Gazette. No post has been located on Knecht's corner, while two have been set on East avenue, a short distance below, within a distance of seventy-five feet from each other. This is the only point on which fault is found with the streets and alleys committee. Knecht's corner, during the evening, is the busiest in the city; it was a manifest oversight to neglect placing one at that place; however, there are several posts held in reserve for supplying deficiencies like the one mentioned, and we presume the committee will not hesitate to meet the wishes of the majority so soon as the matter is brought to their notice.

The gas is of excellent quality and gives far better satisfaction than expected from the experimental use. Kankakee is indebted for this important adjunct to our prosperity solely to the enterprise of the St. Louis National Building Company, of which S. B. Dugger is secretary and at present general superintendent of its affairs in this city. The new works are in every respect a credit to Kankakee, and the officers and employees of the company worthy representatives of a substantial and energetic corporation.

SYNOPSIS OF MEETINGS

August Meeting

There was only a Board Meeting held this month. The Regional Workshop was discussed and decisions made concerning freebie bags and sale items.

September Meeting

It was announced that forty-two people attended the Heritage Quest Show in July.

Bruce Clark, County Clerk, has arranged for the LDS to microfilm courthouse records. A group needs to be formed to contact people in the area who have anything that should be copied when the Mormons are here.

November Meeting

Instead of having a Regional Workshop next year, the society will work on the Illinois State Conference which will be held in Naperville. The conference has been scheduled for October 28 & 29, 1989, and will be held at the Crown Plaza in Naperville. There is a \$700 charge for conference rooms which can be eliminated if 120 people stay 2 nights at the Crown Plaza. The conference will include tours to the Archives and Newberry Library.

President Burden will send a letter to the three other societies from the Regional Workshop suggesting Fox Valley provide transportation, Will Grundy sponsor one tour and South Suburban sponsor the other tour. No decisions have been made as yet as to speakers.

No new information has been received on when the LDS will be in our area to microfilm records. Nelda Ravens put together a list of schools, churches, and funeral homes to be contacted. Members will call these organizations to see if they are interested in having their records microfilmed.

Since there were so few members at the meeting, a nominating committee was not selected. Instead Nelda Ravens made a motion to re-elect the current Officers for 1989. Peg Paschke seconded the motion, which was carried.

The Program was a video cassette entitled "The Immigrant Experience".

December Meeting

The December Meeting was a traditional English meal at Marcia Stang's home on December 3.

Ardis Boone has compiled a book entitled "St. Anne Catholic Church Marriage Records 1872-1982". These books will be sold for \$16.00 at the Library.

The program was presented by Rachael Mellon who spoke on "Barking up your Family Tree" and "Introduction to English Genealogical Research".

SALVATION ARMY REUNITES NIECE, AUNT

The following undated article was submitted - Dear Abby:

I am writing to thank you for an article you printed in The Cleveland Plain Dealer in September, 1987, telling your readers that the Salvation Army could help them find long-lost relatives.

I immediately wrote, asking if they could locate my niece whom I had not seen since she was 13 weeks old. Stella, who was named for me, was the only child of my brother, Harry Selavko, who was killed in World War II. The Salvation Army sent me a form requesting specific information to help them in the search. I filled it out and mailed it promptly.

I heard nothing for 10 months. Then out of the blue, I received a telephone call from a woman in Austin, Texas. She said, "Hello, Stella? This is Stella." I nearly fainted! The Salvation Army had found my niece. She is now 45 years old, and the mother of three!

Stella said she was thrilled to know that someone in her father's family had taken the trouble to look for her, because she had always felt that her father's family didn't care about her. Abby, it's a long story, but while my brother was overseas, his wife fell in love with another man, so she wrote Harry a "Dear John" letter, asking for a divorce. However, the divorce never materialized because Harry was killed before he could answer her letter. His daughter, Stella, who was 14 months old at the time, never knew her biological father or any member of his family.....

Readers, the Salvation Army operates a Missing Persons Locator Service in 86 countries of the world. This service is available to the public. Those interested should be aware of the following basic guidelines.

1. The inquirer should be searching for a near relative. Please do not request a search for old classmates, sweethearts, wartime buddies, friends or neighbors. And do not ask to find runaway adult children, or someone who has left town owing you money.
2. The Inquirer must be able to provide essential information about the missing person.
3. The Salvation Army reserves the right to accept or reject any request for services based upon consideration of reasonableness, feasibility or motive.
4. The inquirer may secure information and/or a missing persons inquiry form by contacting the nearest Salvation Army office in his area or by contacting the nearest Territorial Headquarters.

PRECIOUS MEMORIES OF MY FATHER

There are many precious memories we all have of our fathers, mine like many others, are special memories of love and pride.

My father was a man of great dignity, a true family man, a good person who loved his family, home, people, animals and all of nature. His life was not an easy one, he had to struggle just to make a meager living most all the years of his life in a factory. At that time there were no unions. It was not unusual for him to work eighteen hours a day, six days a week, lifting heavy crates of kitchen stoves. Never did he complain about the hard work. He remained a happy, contented man who loved the very gift of life.

Dad was a gifted man who had many different talents. As a young man who worked on the farm with his father, he would often travel miles to distant towns to sing at weddings and funerals. This was by way of horseback. Dad was a good-looking man, quite athletic, he carried himself well and made a striking appearance. He had curly black hair and dark eyes. It was his pride that sustained him all through the rough years of his life.

A caring person, dad helped out our relatives, friends and neighbors whenever and however he could. He often sat up nights with sick people and at the time of death, he could be counted on to help in many different ways.

Dad built our modest bungalow with his own hands. We had a lovely yard with a white picket fence. He was especially proud of his lawn, fruit trees and huge garden. He shared everything we owned with others. After long hard days at the factory, his greatest pleasure was to work in his garden or go fishing. He would be up as early as four a.m. to fish before leaving for work. He not only gave most of the catch of fish away, he also cleaned them till they were ready for frying. Hard work for him was a habit.

Father had been a barber by trade, but poor eyesight forced him to give it up at an early age. He would then cut hair for the poor in our neighborhood with the understanding they did not have to pay him. He also repaired shoes, charging folks only for the materials he used.

As a young child I was sickly. Dad would blow smoke from his pipe into my ears to ease the terrible earaches. He would then rock me until I relaxed and went to sleep. Only then would he go to bed.

He was also a wonderful entertainer. We would play cards and though I sometimes cheated, he never scolded me. I would then feel guilty and tell him. He took me fishing and always introduced me to his friends as his "little boy". He thought this very funny. In the cold winter months, our big treat of the evening was to fry onions and potatoes in an old skillet on top of the coal furnace. Every bite was heavenly. Then there was Jack Benny on the radio and our evening was complete.

Dad was a very sentimental person by nature and he cried often and easily. He would get out his old hanky and dry his tears from time to time, but

never did he consider this unmanly. Crying was another part of life. His warm heart overflowed with sympathy and concern for everyone he met.

My mother was ill for several years and it was dad who took care of her. Though he was nearly blind by this time, he was determined that mom would stay home with him. It was as she wished. He was then in his eighties.

The last few years of his life were spent in a nursing home. He adjusted well. The nurses and aides grew to love him too and often gave him a tender hug or a kiss on the cheek. They called him 'Dad'. He was deeply respected as a gentleman.

At eighty-seven years Dad fell and broke his hip. He died as he had lived with dignity. Today on Father's Day, I thank God for giving me such a loving father. Dad I love you and honor you. My memories of you are all good ones. You are remembered as you lived, with deep respect and pride.

HISTORY OF THE SEVENTY-SIXTH INFANTRY

The Seventy-sixth Illinois Volunteer Infantry was organized at Kankakee, Illinois, in August, 1862, by Colonel A. W. Mack, and was mustered in August 22d, 1862.

Immediately after its muster it was ordered to Columbus, Kentucky, at which place it arrived August 29th, and soon after was armed with Enfield Rifle Muskets. Remained at Columbus, drilling and doing fatigue and picket duty, until October 4th, when the Regiment was ordered to Bolivar, Tenn., by rail, at which place it arrived October 5th, and camped near the city until November 3d, when the Regiment with other troops was moved to LaGrange, Tenn., and remained there until November 30th, when it was sent with General Grant on his campaign along the Mississippi Central Railroad; was at Holly Springs on the 29th and at Waterford on the 30th, doing its part in driving Price's army southwest.

The Fourth Division of the Thirteenth Army Corps, to which the Seventy-sixth belonged, remained near Waterford contending with fierce storms and fathomless mud until December 10th, when it continued its march southward, crossing the Tallahatchie River, passing through Abbeville and Oxford, and halting near Springdale, until December 22d, when the information was received that the Rebel General VanDorn had captured Holly Springs in the rear of the army and destroyed a large quantity of supplies and cut off all communication with the North.

The entire command was "about faced" and proceeded northward, living off the country and at times on extremely short rations.

After several days slow marching and much speculation in the entire absence of northern news as to what was to become of the regiment and the army and the country, Holly Springs was entered on the 5th of January, 1863, at which place it remained until January 10th, witnessing many extensive condensations.

The Seventy-sixth was the last regiment leaving the city. It marched out about sunset, and the Rebels hovering around in the vicinity occupied the city immediately upon its exit. The Regiment arrived at Moscow on the evening of January 11th and remained there until February 5th, on full rations. At this place the Regiment received official information of the resignation of Col. Mack, who was at that time absent from the Regiment. Lieut. Col. Bussey was soon after promoted to Colonel.

On February 5th, the camp of the Regiment was moved, through snow and mud, about ten miles, to the village of Lafayette, where it remained until March 10th, when after a three days' march it arrived at Memphis, Tenn., where it remained until May 13th, when it embarked with other troops on a fleet of steamers and moved down the Mississippi River. The steamer "Fort Wayne," carrying the Seventy-sixth, was fired into in the night by a band of guerrillas from the Arkansas shore. Two men were wounded and the boat disabled. The Regiment landed in the morning and burned the buildings on the plantations in the vicinity. The disabled boat was towed down the river with the fleet to Young's Point, Louisiana, where it landed May 17th.

On the 18th the Regiment marched across the Point to the river below Vicksburg and embarked for Grand Gulf, and returned to Young's Point on the 29th and immediately embarked for "Chicasaw Bayou," on the Yazoo River, at which place it debarked on the same day; was engaged in closing up the lines in the rear of Vicksburg until, after the charge, when it was placed on the left of the besieging lines, and bravely held its place close under the Rebel guns until the final surrender July 4th. On the 5th of July the Regiment moved with Sherman's army against Jackson, Miss., skirmishing with the enemy at Big Black River and at Champion Hill. At Jackson the Rebels under Johnson made a stand and engaged our forces from the 12th to the 16th, the Seventy-sixth occupying the extreme right of the attacking force.

On the morning of the 17th the city was found vacated by the Rebels and the Union troops occupied it immediately. The Regiment left Jackson July 31st and arrived at Vicksburg on the 23d, remaining there until August 11th, when it embarked and moved down the river to Natchez, landing there on the 12th. Remained there in camp until the latter part of November, when it was ordered back to Vicksburg, where it went into camp about eight miles from the city at "Camp Cowan."

Enjoyed life at this camp until January 21, 1863, then moved about three miles to "Camp Hebron." On February 13 the Seventy-sixth started with General Sherman on his Meridian campaign and was on the move continually until March 4th, when the expedition returned and the Regiment rested at "Camp Hebron" until April 5th, when it moved to "Big Black River Bridge," and was on duty there until April 27th, when it returned to Vicksburg and camped on the high hills surrounding the city.

On the 4th of May the Regiment accompanied an expedition, commanded by General McArthur, to Yazoo City, and participated in the battles of Benton, Vaughn's Station and Deasonville, and drove the enemy from Yazoo City, and occupied the place several days. On the night of May 17 a large portion of the city was burned. The Regiment returned to Vicksburg May 21, and occupied its camp on the hills until June 29, when it was moved to Mount Auburn, on the railroad between Vicksburg and the Big Black River. On the 23th moved back to Vicksburg and camped near its old quarters. On July 1, 1864, the Regiment started on an expedition to Jackson, commanded by General Slocum. On its return the command was met between Jackson and Clinton by the enemy, and a sharp battle was fought on the 4th, and renewed on the 5th, when the Seventy-sixth, which bore a prominent part in the engagement, was cut off from the balance of the command, but cut its way out, losing one hundred and two men, sixteen of whom were reported killed and left on the field, and eighty-six wounded and missing. The Regiment returned to Vicksburg July 9, much fatigued. On July 29 the Regiment embarked, and was run down the river on a marine boat to Morganza; landed there, and remained camped along the levee until August 21, when it was embarked and was transported down the river to Fort Hudson; landed and marched, with five days' rations, in great haste, night and day, to Clinton, expecting to annihilate the enemy in that vicinity, but he fled before the Yankee boats. The Regiment returned to Morganza, arriving there August 23, foot-sore and weary.

On September 2 the Regiment embarked on the steamer "Nebraska," and moved up the Mississippi River to the mouth of White River, landed and camped on the Arkansas shore, and remained until October 18, when it was ordered to Memphis, Tenn., but returned October 25, and occupied quarters there until November 7, when it embarked and moved up White River to Duvall's Bluff, Arkansas, where it built neat log cabins, and fled to stay; but in obedience to orders, it broke up its pleasant camp on the 28th, embarked, and was landed at Memphis, Tenn., on the 30th, and camped on the environs of the city; remained there until December 31, 1864, and was then ordered to embark on the steamer "Niagara" for New Orleans, at which place it arrived January 4, 1865, and went into camp a few miles above the city, at Kenner, behind the levee, where the mud was almost fathomless. Remained there until February 12, when the Regiment was ordered to embark on Gulf steamers and proceed across the Gulf to Mobile Point. The Regiment was divided, and carried on three different crafts. The "George Peabody" carried the Regimental Headquarters, with four companies of the Seventy-sixth, and parts of other regiments, and a large number of horses, mules and wagons. A terrible storm on the Gulf nearly wrecked the craft. The horses, mules and wagons were consigned to the deep, and the boat was barely gotten back to the Mississippi River with its human freight. Went back to New Orleans, crossed over to Lake Pontchartrain, embarked on the steamer "Alice Vivian," and moved by the lakes to Fort Morgan, and from there to Fort Barrancas, near Pensacola, Florida, where the Regiment was again united, February 18, and went into camp, and remained there until March 11, when the camp was moved to Pensacola. On March 20, the Regiment started with General Steel's expedition to Spanish Fort and Fort Blakely, near Mobile, Alabama. Traveled through pine swamps, corduroying the quicksand roads as it moved along, and fighting the enemy in front, until April 1, when the Army approached Blakely, and on the 2nd drove the enemy inside his fortifications. General Steel's forces united with General Canby's and General Granger's, from Fort Morgan. April 8 Spanish Fort was captured, and April 9 the Seventy-sixth participated in the charge on Fort Blakely, capturing the entire garrison. The colors of the Seventy-sixth were the first planted on the enemy's works. The Regiment lost in this, the last battle of the war, seventeen killed and eighty-one wounded. Among the latter was the colonel of the Regiment, who was painfully wounded while gallantly leading his men in the assault.

The Regiment camped inside the fortifications until April 20, when it was transported to Mobile. On the 22d of April the regiment accompanied a fleet of steamers, loaded with soldiers, up the Alabama River, General Steel in command; landed at Selma, Alabama, April 23; remained there until May 11, and was then ordered back to Mobile, and camped near the city. Remained there doing duty until the latter part of June, when it was ordered to Galveston, Texas, where it remained until July 22, and was then mustered out, and ordered to Chicago, Illinois, where it was paid off and disbanded August 4, 1865.

The Regiment had traveled over ten thousand miles. Received one hundred and fifty-six recruits, who were transferred, on its muster out, to the Thirty-seventh Illinois Infantry.
