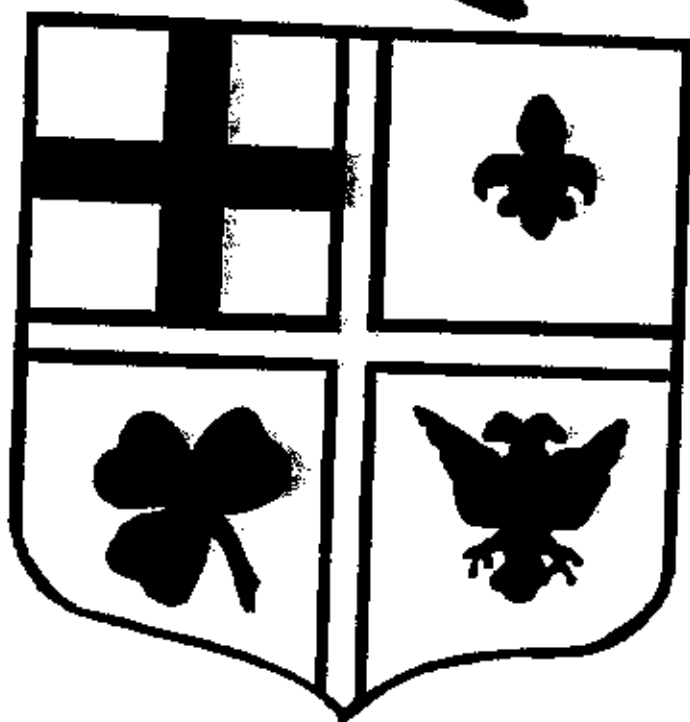

BIG FIRE AT ST. ANNE - 1877

Taken from The Kankakee Gazette, September 27, 1877.

Sept. 25 - A fire broke out in a coal shed behind Louis Goyette's building on Station Street this morning about 1 o'clock; supposed to be the work of an incendiary, as no fire or lights were burning in the building at the time. Six buildings were totally destroyed.

The building owned by Louis Goyette was occupied by the following persons: On ground floor, Misses Drolet & Roi, millinery shop. No insurance on their stock: loss to stock about \$10. Next was Miss Coulombre's millinery shop. Loss estimated at \$15. No insurance on her stock. Next was Joe Mombbleau's harness shop and A. Burk's boot and shoe shop, both occupying the same room. Loss to both parties about \$50: no insurance. Next was Paul E. Gros drug store, formerly Mathiew & Paradis. Loss about \$1400 to stock, but insured in Springfield insurance company of Springfield, Mass, for \$1300. On the second floor of the same building, over the drug store, was the residence of Mr. Gros. Loss to his household goods \$100; insurance in German American for \$200. Next to Mr. Gros' residence was Joe Mombbleau's family. Loss to furniture about \$150; no insurance. Next to Mr. Mombbleau's was the I.O.O.F. hall, occupied by centennial lodge No. 603. Nothing was saved in the hall as the fire was under too great headway. Loss, \$100: no insurance.

The second building was occupied and owned by J. B. Allie, who kept a saloon on the ground floor and lived on the second floor. Loss about \$2500 on building and furniture: no insurance.

The third building was owned and occupied by J. F. Bristol as a dwelling - a two story residence. Loss, \$1000 on building and breakage of furniture. Five hundred dollars insurance on building and \$250 on furniture.

The fourth building was a residence owned by Mr. Sprimont and occupied by D. Fortier (formerly of the Lafayette House) as his residence. His loss is about \$25; no insurance. Mr. Sprimont suffers a total loss of building; estimated at \$300.

The fifth building was the two story house owned by L. Bass and occupied by him on the second floor as a residence. Loss on building \$1500: no insurance. The ground floor of this building was occupied by Edmund Longten, who carried on a bakery and lived in the back part of the house. Loss about \$10; no insurance.

The sixth and last building was Dalpay & Drolet's boot and shoe store on Station Street, opposite the Lafayette House. The boys, Joe and Theo, occupied the second floor as sleeping rooms. Dammage to their stock, \$400; but insured in the Phoenix of Chicago to the amount of \$500. This building belonged also to Louis Goyette, who was the heaviest loser, as he had not kept up the insurance on either of the buildings and his total loss will amount to \$3000. Several buildings near by were scorched by the intense heat. Mrs. Paradis' house was saved by the constant pouring of water on the roof by citizens. Fortunately the wind came from the south. If it had come from the north most of the town would have been in ashes. As we have had no rain lately everything burned like tinder.

But few of the above named physicians have received their diplomas from the State Board of Health. Under the new law this is a pre-requisite for the practice of medicine in this State, and it is desirable that all should comply with the law as speedily as possible.

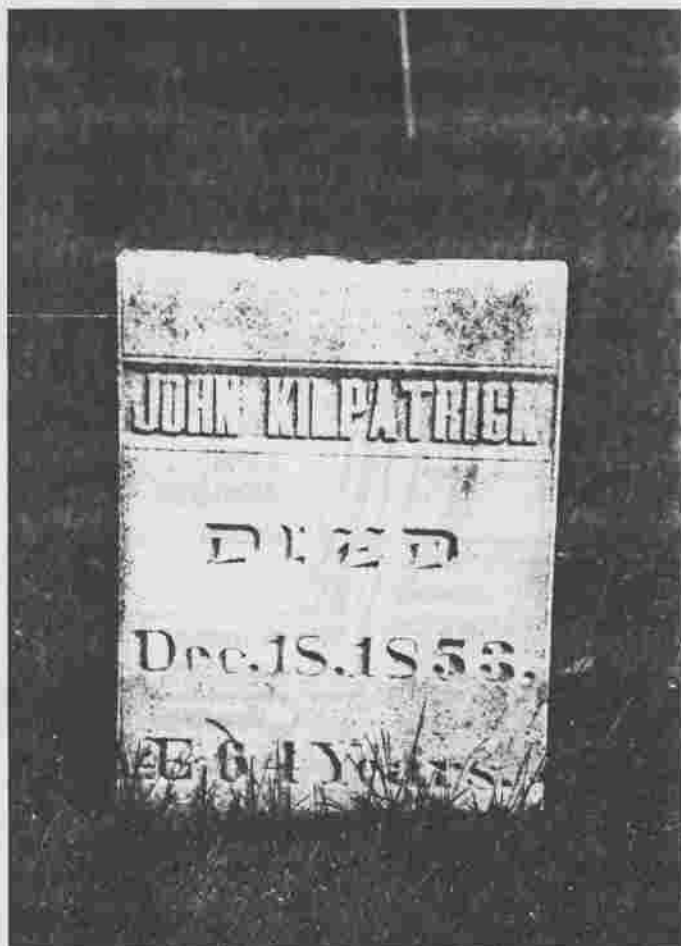

CEMETERY TROVE BRINGS EARLY CHICAGO TO LIFE

A local schoolteacher has uncovered a longlost cache of 150-year-old documents that, experts say, significantly deepens historians' understanding of Chicago's formative years.

Helen Sclair's discovery of the records of a former city cemetery on the site of what is now Lincoln Park provides scholars with a better picture of where Chicago's pioneer settlers came from, as well as a portrait of the kinds of lives they led here. Among Sclair's finds is a tantalizing hint that Chicago's tradition of wheeler-dealer politics goes back to the days of Ft. Dearborn.

Sclair made her find in a recently opened state archive at Northeastern Illinois university, on the city's northwest side. Among the documents she uncovered was a demographic gold mine of undertakers reports. They record the passing, month by month, of Chicago's early settlers, plus their ages and birthplaces, where they resided and the causes of death.

That material, Sclair feels, will help students of immigration trace the routes by which Chicago's first citizens came here from their European homelands. It should also help historians of medicine chart the progress of the great epidemics of cholera that swept over early Chicago.

In 1842, the city fathers established a municipal burial ground on a tract of land, then on Chicago's outskirts, roughly bounded by North Avenue, LaSalle Street, Wisconsin Street and State Street. By the close of the Civil War, though, residences were being built on nearby North Side streets. So the city decided to convert the land to a lakefront park, naming it after the recently assassinated Abraham Lincoln.

Through subsequent decades, bodies that interfered with the park's development were moved to outlying cemeteries such as Rosehill and Graceland on the North Side and Oakwoods on the South Side.

But Sclair's research shows that some families were still fighting the removal of forebear's remains as late as the turn of the century. Indeed, Sclair thinks that all of the bodies may not yet be out of Lincoln Park. Some families were burying loved ones on the lakefront site before it was designated a cemetery, she says, and in the early 19th century graves were sometimes marked with simple wooden crosses, some of which must have decayed over the years. Others would have been consumed in the Great Chicago Fire of 1871.

"I found an old document appointing Joseph E. Ernst the city sexton that notes he is qualified to manage the cemetery because of his 'excellent memory'," Sclair says. "The city fathers were depending upon him to know where the bodies were buried. But nobody is infallible, and with time the locations of some gravesites had to have been lost."

Some corpses, though, were removed from the old city cemetery even before the decision to make it into a park. Nineteenth Century medical schools were often short of cadavers, for which some institutions willingly paid cash, no questions asked, Sclair notes. The city cemetery was hit by such a large wave of grave robberies in the 1850's that the aldermen were forced to take action by hiring famous detective Alan Pinkerton to locate the thieves.

Currently, the only visible sign of Lincoln Park's prehistory is a single mausoleum, just northeast of the Chicago Historical Society, and one other grave marker, about 100 feet south of the Chicago Academy of Sciences.

Records of the former lakefront cemetery and other old public documents, packed away and forgotten, rested for decades in a municipal warehouse on the Southwest Side amid a great miscellany of city property, including sewer pipes and rusting fire trucks. It wasn't until 1984 that they again came to light during a routine survey of the warehouse's contents, after which the state archivist's office brought the material to Springfield for extensive conservation efforts.

Sclair seems to have been first to guess that the archive might contain records of the old lakefront cemetery, papers that would offer a unique opportunity for reconstructing the early social history of Chicago. "Helen Sclair was waiting for us at the door the day the archive (at Northeastern Illinois) opened late last year," Karl Moore says. Sclair eventually found more than 600 relevant documents, had them photographed, then copied by hand their virtually illegible 19th Century handwritings. To date, Sclair and her associates have identified about 4,000 early Chicagoans who acquired burial lots in the lakefront cemetery or were themselves buried there.

Sclair plans to publish the material in a book, possibly as early as this fall, under the sponsorship of the Chicago Genealogical Society.

KANKAKEE COUNTY ANCESTOR BOOK

A meeting was held in May on the upcoming Ancestor Book. The following decisions were made:

1. The book will be listed in alphabetical order by Member Surname, not ancestor surname. There will be a complete surname index at the back of the book.
2. Ancestors listed in the book must have lived in the county during the 100 years following the formation of the county (1853 - 1953}.
3. After the initial ancestor chart, only charts tracing the Kankakee Co. ancestors will be included. Family Group Sheets will not be included.
- ~. There will be a County History in the front of the book.
5. There will be a section of photographs in the book.
6. November 1, 1991, will be the cut-off date for submission of charts and photographs.

Anyone who hasn't sent in their charts on Kankakee County ancestors should do so immediately. All charts and photographs should be sent to the attention of Marcia Stang.

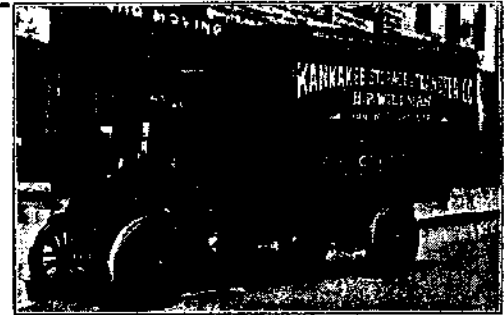

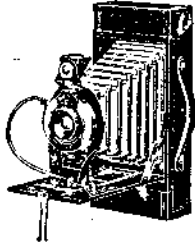

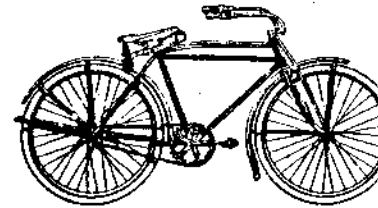
